
YTD OCTOBER 2018 FINANCIAL RESULTS

As of October 31, 2018:

- Revenue: WBENC has reached \$12.5mm, achieving 2018 forecast
- Expenses: \$10.8mm, which is 87% of the forecast amount of \$12.4mm
- Change in Net Assets (Net Income): \$1.6mm (This will be greatly reduced by the end of the year; WBENC forecasted a slightly higher net income than budgeted.)

YTD OCTOBER 2018 FINANCIAL RESULTS

Balance Sheet as of October 31, 2018

- Cash \$4.2mm (\$4.3mm at 10/31/2017)
- Accounts Receivable, net \$684k (\$338k at 10/31/2017)
- Net Liquid Current Assets \$4.6mm at 10/31/18 versus \$4.4mm at 10/31/17 (Cash + Accounts Receivable – Accounts Payable and Accrued Expenses)
- Net Working Capital \$4.1mm at 10/31/2018 versus \$3.9mm at 10/31/2017 (Current Assets Current Liabilities)







ABOUT USVCC

USVCC was established to serve the interests of Veterans, Veteran owned business, and the United States economy by advocating Veteran business advancement, economic development, and job creation. USVCC focuses on "the whole Veteran".



VETERAN CERTIFICATION

US Veteran's Chamber of Commerce has engaged in confidential conversation with WBENC to explore the possibility of WBENC executing Veteran certification.

WBENC IS UNDER A NDA REGARDING THIS TOPIC AND OUR DISCUSSION TODAY IS HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL AND CANNOT BE SHARED EXTERNALLY.

The need for a uniform gold standard certification program is an imperative best practice as set forth by private and public corporations that support certifiers such as the Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC).

The certification desired by USVCC would encompass Veterans, Spouses/Permanent Caregivers and Gold Star Moms.

CASE FOR ACTION

Our discussion today:

Is there a consensus to form a sub team to explore the case to move forward with developing a model for Veteran certification to be executed by the WBENC network on behalf of USVCC? Pros? Cons?

The analysis by this sub committee will determine whether we move forward into the next phase of planning and defining the process, parameters, etc. The committee will be comprised of volunteers and will need to complete the analysis and decision process by the end of January 2019 at the latest.
